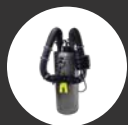
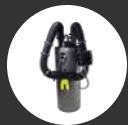


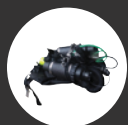
KEY DIFFERENCES



The Sidekick has a single counter-lung with the scrubber canister located inside the counter-lung. This provides an extremely versatile unit.



The Sidekick is well-suited for cold-water diving. With the scrubber canister located inside the counter-lung, the scrubber stays warmer and the heat generated by the chemical reaction helps keep the diver warmer.



The Sidewinder has dual scrubber canisters mounted one on each side of the body, with counter-lungs across the small of the back. This results in an incredibly well-balanced and stable unit that is a dream to dive.

KISS SIDEKICK

- Versatility- can be side-mounted, stage mounted, no-mounted, used as a bail-out rebreather, etc
- Ease of removal to fit through small spaces
- Ease in flood recovery
- Cold water performance

Best for : explorers, cold-water divers & experienced sidemount divers

KISS SIDEWINDER

- Compact and lightweight for travel
 - Stable, well balanced, and easy to trim
 - Fantastic work-of-breathing in all positions
 - Dual scrubbers reduce the risk of channeling
 - Canisters can be swapped out independently
- Best for : divers of all experience levels & those slightly warmer waters

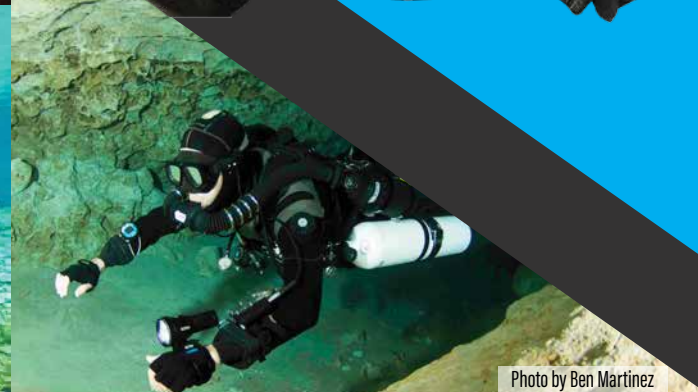

SIMILARITIES

Both the Sidekick and Sidewinder are simple, reliable, mechanically controlled rebreathers. Like all KISS rebreathers they use the well proven KISS MAV technology. This consists of a constant oxygen flow through an orifice supplemented by a manual add button. The diver monitors and controls the oxygen levels.

SIDEMOUNT OPTIONS*

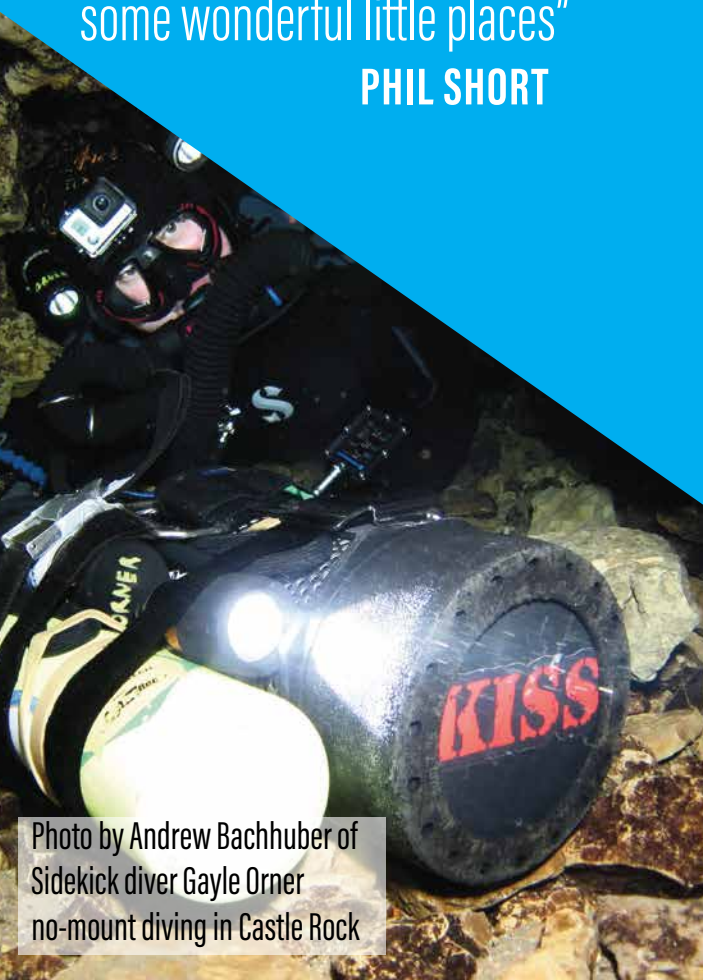
